



## The Post Stroke Transitional Care Program

The goals of the program are to maximize stroke recovery and provide multiple avenues for successful community re-integration by offering a comprehensive continuum of services including education, socialization, recreation, assessment and therapy; and connecting individuals to needed community health and social services.

The Supportive Housing Unit is for individuals transitioning from hospital to the community who are ready to begin full community integration. Services are designed to assist in a variety of situations, such as respite/caregiver relief and a transition home to a private residence, long-term care facility or retirement home.

Eligibility criteria for admission:

- Has been diagnosed as having had a stroke
- Medically stable or able to have needs met by existing community service providers
- Able to direct or learn to direct services
- Able to participate in all activities of daily living
- Willing to participate in programming/educational opportunities, if applicable
- Able to live safely unattended (assistance is by appointment)
- Requires a maximum of 3 hours of attendant care per day
- Able to transition from the unit after an agreed time as residence is only temporary
- Able to cover the cost of \$45 per diem (includes cost of food, lodging, & trained Independent Living Assistants)
